



The Bloomberg Barclays Municipal High Yield Bond Index is a flagship measure

of the non-investment grade and non-rated USD-denominated tax exempt bond market. Included in the index are securities from all 50 US States and four other qualifying regions (Washington DC, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Virgin Islands). The index includes state and local general obligation bonds and revenue bonds. All bonds in the Municipal High Yield Bond Index are tax exempt, and hence are not eligible for other indices that include taxable high yield bonds, such as the US High Yield Index and EM USD Aggregate Index. The Municipal High Yield Bond Index has history going back to October 1995.

The Bloomberg Barclays Municipal Bond Index is a flagship measure of the USD-denominated tax exempt bond market over 1 year to maturity. The index includes four main sectors: state and local general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, insured bonds, and prerefunded bonds. The Municipal Bond Index has history going back to January 1980. In addition, several subindices based on maturity and revenue source have been created, some with inception dates after January 1980 but no later than July 1, 1993. Tax exempt bonds in the Municipal Bond Index are not eligible for the US Aggregate, US Universal, and Multiverse indices.
